




Women Making History

Requirements and Submission Instructions:

1. Read the quotes on the next page and describe how your nominee has encompassed the message of the quote.
2. Answer all of the questions so we have enough information to share, throughout an entire week, if your nominee is chosen.
3. Submit this completed form (front and back) AND one or more of the following:
 - ◇ A clear, quality picture of you and the nominee.
 - ◇ A picture of the nominee doing what they do best.
 - ◇ A link to a social media account of the nominee (this can be a personal page, their business page, etc.)
4. Submit a completed nomination by February 28, 2018.
